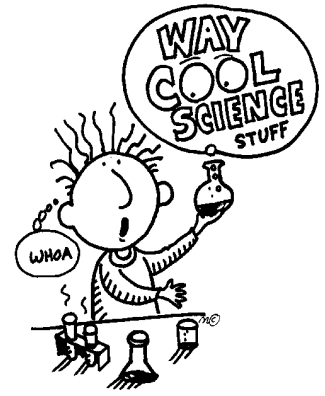


The Science Bag
